Bruce Mines with its gift and antique shops, groceries store, LCBO outlet, restaurants and take-outs, bank, post office, marina /waterfront and other amenities, it is posed as the gateway to the area. A wide variety of accommodations are available either within the town (3) or Plummer Additional (7). Wherever you are, it is only a short distance to the town.

With beautiful landscapes, productive agricultural, farmers' markets, farm gate sales, public boat launches, fishing, home based industry and artisan outlets, the opportunities are limitless while still preserving the quaint, quiet, and rural atmosphere.
