Jane Smith gave a power point presentation on the history of Bruce Mines & District to the Sault Ste Marie branch of the Ontario Genealogical Society on November 20, 2012.

Jean Kettles spoke to students at Arthur Henderson Public School about the history of Bruce Mines and answered questions about the Museum and the Simpson Mine Shaft.

Ms. Petrocco's class visited the museum in September. Students were interested to learn the co-founder of the museum was Arthur Henderson, whom their school was named after. They also enjoyed guessing the purpose for many of the artifacts.

Connie Bennett set up a Remembrance Day display of uniforms and military memorabilia at the Arthur Henderson School.

Fundraising activities and applying for grants are ongoing activities. During the Car Show in June, Art and Reg Bennett sold pulled pork on a bun and donated the proceeds to the Historical Society.
